**Nichole Hansen** is the CEO of Handersen Publishing LLC, a family-owned independent press focused on creating engaging books for young readers. The company started in 2016 in Lincoln with five books and a literary magazine. Three years later, the company has more than 40 children's books published and distributed internationally. Handersen Publishing's catalog includes picture, early reader, middle grade and young adult books. They are available in bookstores and libraries around the world, from Cambridge, England and Carmel, Indiana to Christchurch, New Zealand.

In September 2019, the *Lincoln Journal Star* newspaper presented Nichole with the "Inspire Award for Excellence in Entrepreneurship" for her entrepreneurship, leadership and service to the community. The award was presented at the Inspire Awards Luncheon attended by more than 800 people. Hansen manages the business, marketing, design and financial side of Handersen Publishing. She works with authors and illustrators on four continents. Handersen Publishing books have won eight national awards to date and been featured in national and international media, such as *Publishers Weekly, Kirkus Reviews, Story Monsters Ink*, NET Radio, *The Lincoln Journal Star* and *The Bellevue Record*.

Hansen is also a poet and the author of seven children's books including the award-winning non-fiction book *The Thumb Book of Kindness*. Her poetry collection *When I Was a Grownup* is used by educators across the country.

Hansen presents poetry, theater and literacy workshops at libraries, schools, YMCAs, after-school clubs, community learning centers, museums and arts festivals across the Midwest. Active in her community, she has partnered with local nonprofits such as the Lincoln Housing Authority's "Reading Matters" program (getting age-appropriate books to children whose families reside in low-income housing) and the Lincoln Arts Council's UpstArt program for Title I schools in Lincoln, Neb.

To serve both a global audience, Handersen Publishing translates its most popular books into many languages including Arabic, Spanish, Portuguese, French and Chinese.

Hansen is also an active parent to two young children. She and her husband Tevin Hansen have made their family life and their children part of the Handersen Publishing business – even incorporating their children's handprints in the company logo.

# Question and Answer with Nichole Hansen, author of *Sharky Dreams of Pizza*

- Why did you write Sharky Dreams of Pizza? Three things inspired this project. The first was a story my daughter would tell called Sharky and the Giant Pizza. It was about a boy named Sharky who was best friends with a giant pizza. The second was the baby shark song, which has been stuck in my head since...forever. Also, pizza is delicious. When you combine all of these random things together you get a book about friendship, a shark and pizza.
- Your poetry book for children, When I Was a Grown-Up is used in classrooms for new readers across the country. Your newest poetry book Bumble Bee Sneeze covers both happy and sad experiences. Why do you like writing poetry for young children? Each poem is like its own little story. With a poetry collection you have the opportunity to tell lots of little stories that can be about SO many different things. They can be about acting like a dinosaur or hiding in laundry. You might have a heavy poem about being sick and in the hospital, but then you can lighten the mood with smelly brothers. As a writer it's fun because you aren't held within the constraints of a traditional story line.
- What was your favorite childhood book (or author)? Why? I LOVED reading as a child, but anything by Shel Silverstein was/is an immediate favorite.
- When did you start writing? I started writing when I as four years old (I think). I had the chicken pox and my mom had me tell a story which she wrote down, and then I illustrated. It was about two princesses and their pets. Since then writing has been an outlet during tough times, or anytime when my emotions were too big. Through writing you can break the big things into little parts and figure them out, one at a time.
- What was the inspiration for your picture book *Sharky Dreams of Pizza*? Why did you imagine a shark and a boy could be friends? I liked the idea of two creatures (natural enemies), who find something in common, even if it is something a bit absurd, like pizza.
- You present literacy workshops and book readings for libraries, schools and museums. How do you incorporate your theater background in presentations? The Thumb Theatre presentation is pretty obviously inspired by my theatre background. But I've found that whenever you're presenting, whether it's for kids or grownups, a theatre background comes in handy. Theatre teaches you to know your crowd, speak up, and find confidence in a roll. So, with each presentation I pick a roll. Sometimes it's a children's author, other times it's the CEO of an independent publishing house.
- What aspects of your own life helped inspire Sharky Dreams of Pizza? There are four people in
  my family, my husband, two children and myself. Only one person likes pizza, and that is me.
   Sometimes I feel like Sharky, alone and looking for a friend that understands how delicious pizza
  is.

# Question and Answer with Nichole Hansen, author of Zany Can Do Anything

- Why did you write Zany Can Do Anything? A little boy came up to me at an event to ask if we had a unicorn book because he LOVED unicorns. We didn't, and he was surprisingly sad. He also told me ALL about how difficult it was to find a unicorn book that wasn't pink and purple. He then went on to tell me all about his favorite unicorn books. I loved this kids' confidence, and that he knew what he wanted, and I wanted to write a book just for him, even though I may never see him again.
- Your poetry book for children, When I Was a Grown-Up is used in classrooms for new readers across the country. Your newest poetry book Bumble Bee Sneeze covers both happy and sad experiences. Why do you like writing poetry for young children? Each poem is like its own little story. I wanted to expand on this idea by also adding the concepts of dreaming big and being yourself.
- You present literacy workshops and book readings for libraries, schools and museums. How do you incorporate your theater background in presentations? The Thumb Theatre presentation is pretty obviously inspired by my theatre background. But I've found that whenever you're presenting, whether it's for kids or grownups, a theatre background comes in handy. Theatre teaches you to know your crowd, speak up, and find confidence in a roll. So, with each presentation I pick a roll. Sometimes it's a children's author, other times it's the CEO of an independent publishing house.
- What aspects of your own life helped inspire Zany Can Do Anything? I may be a bit of a unicorn, myself. Or maybe I just live in a mythical world most of the time. I do know that it took me a really long time to figure out how to be myself and be okay with who that person is. I also know what it means to "Dream Big". When my husband and I started our own independent publishing house, it took a lot of hard work and big dreams to make it happen, it still does. But getting to write books, and bringing them to kids in our community is a blessing beyond words, and I wouldn't have it any other way.
